INTRODUCTION

- Home fellowship is an extension of the church- where members and their families become part small groups of Christians, mostly from the same church, to continue encourage to one another by taking turn in sharing scriptures and prayers outside the church setting.
- The benefits of being a member of a home cell include spiritual growth, being able to share life's challenges and request prayer (corporate prayer). Being able to seek counsel from fellow believers.
- As a new convert the best benefit would being in the presence of “matured” Christians and having someone to guide you as you undertake the journey and life of Christianity.

In this course we will discuss the purpose and the benefits of being a cell member and to provide recommendations for those who may have the desire to be cell leaders one day.

DEFINITIONS

Fellowship:

A relationship of inner unity among believers who share in same interest.

There is co-participation in Christ and with one another in accomplishing God's will on earth.

Home-Fellowship

A group of Christians normally between 3 and 12 who meet regularly in the home of one of the members for prayer and to inspire one another in good work.
